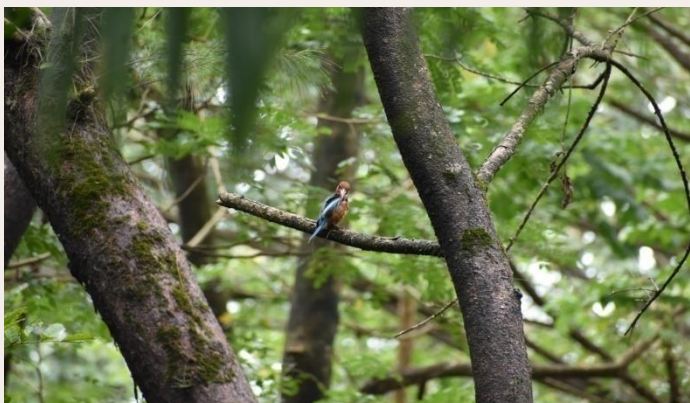

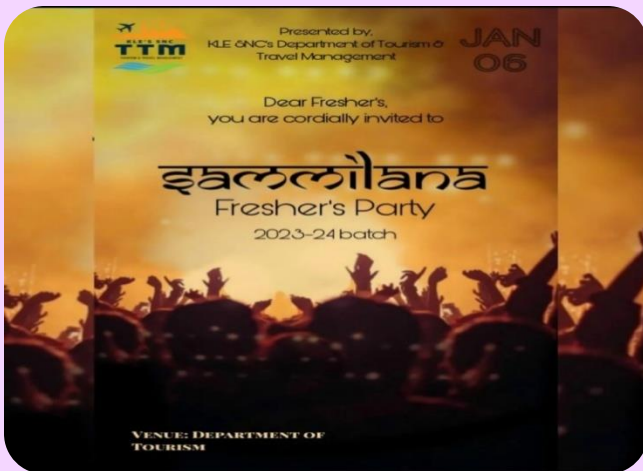


PROGRAMME ON TR CUTTING AND ADVANCE DRAPING TECHNIQUE

The Department of Fashion and Apparel Design, KLE's SNC Collage, Bangalore organized 3 days student and faculty development programme on TR (Transformation Reconstruction) Cutting technique for the students of V sem, III year B.Sc. Students and teaching faculty in Pattern making lab, FAD, KLE SNC, from 8th to 10th January 2024. The subject expert Mrs. Vrunda Srinath, started the programme with introduction to T R Concepts in draping and explained the students its importance in advance draping making in Apparel Design. The speaker demonstrated various draping techniques such as development of basic block on dress forms and mountain valley, godets and pockets developed using Transformation Reconstruction (TR) techniques. Totally 25 students and 2 faculties were benefited by SDP/FDP which enhanced the knowledge on advance pattern making with TR cutting and also as a part of university curriculum.
